

THE HEART OF BRAZIL

Working in conjunction with the photographer Sue Cunningham and her writer husband Patrick, the Penny School Gallery is hosting an exhibition of photographs and extraordinary artefacts from the Xingu Tribes and the Brazilian Rainforest.

Sue's work is highly regarded in Brazil and was recently shown in Sao Paulo and Brasilia. Her latest UK exhibition of this collection of unmatched, stunning images, showcases a culture which is very different from our own, vibrant and alive, yet under serious and immediate threat from the irreversible destruction of the rain forest and invasions into their territory by the outside world.

The Heart of Brazil exhibition resulted from a gruelling six-month expedition, which visited 48 remote tribal villages along the 2,500km Xingu River, a major tributary of the Amazon. Sue and Patrick travelled in a small open boat accompanied only by a local boatman through remote Cerrados and Rain Forest. The video of this remarkable expedition will be premiered as part of the exhibition.

Sue and Patrick received the Neville Shulman Award from the Royal Geographic Society towards funding the expedition, which also received financial support from Rainforest Concern and Artists Project Earth, to whom they give their grateful thanks.
